From The President

This year we are presenting at our Annual General Meeting (AGM) a number of nominees for positions on our Board.

The Board is made up of up to 9 people who are:

- A person who is an employee and has been elected by employees
- Up to 8 other Board members, elected by Voting members

The following nominees are standing for election at our AGM:

Sarah Nash	standing for re election
Alison Donovan	standing for re election
Karl Wairama	co-opted, standing for election
Casey Hucker	co-opted, standing for election
Kelly O'Leary	first time nominee

Although elected Board Members will join Ingrid Squire (term due to end next year) and the employee elected by staff on the 28th June 2020, we anticipate additional vacancies will remain after the AGM, and may consider co-opting further Board members following the AGM.

Each nominee is an Ordinary Member and each has provided information regarding their interest in a position on the Board (see over page).

The nominees will be introduced to our Members at our AGM, prior to voting. Members will have the opportunity to ask them any questions they might have regarding their standing for a Board position at the AGM.

Voting

Although we have fewer members standing for election than positions available, we are still required to conduct a vote for each nominee. Each nominee must receive a simple majority of votes in their favour to be elected (ie 51%).

Voting will be conducted by way of written ballot, the results announced the following day.

Who can vote at an AGM

A Voting member is any person present at the AGM who is:

- A kindergarten appointed Voting member (or their proxy)(Napier based kindergartens)
- An appointed Board Voting Member to vote on behalf of the Board
- A Board Member who has been selected to cast a proxy vote on behalf of Wairoa based kindergarten communities



Role of Our Board

Napier Kindergartens' Board is responsible for the governance of the Association and its role includes:

- Development of the Association's Strategic Plan
- Employment of the General Manager
- Monitoring of strategic outcomes
- Management of risk
- Monitoring of legal compliance
- Setting policies

We need a minimum of 50% of Voting members or their proxies to be present.

If a quorum of Voting Members is not present, a quorum can be achieved if we have 10 people present who are Voting Members, Ordinary Members or Life Members.

The original, written authority assigning the voting power to another Member must be received by the General Manager before the commencement of the AGM.
